With the reactivation of the iconic jazz label, Flying Dutchman, veteran singer and songwriter Billy Valentine becomes the perfect artist to reintroduce the imprint with his sensational new album, *Billy Valentine & The Universal Truth*. Possessing an empathic, lissome voice, Valentine draws upon the

soul-jazz legacy of such iconic Flying Dutchman singer and songwriters as Gil Scott-Heron and Leon Thomas as he delivers testifying renditions of message songs originally recorded and written by Curtis Mayfield, Stevie Wonder, Eddie Kendricks, War, Prince – and of course Scott-Heron and Thomas.

Valentine says that he's always been drawn to message songs. He remembers witnessing the civil rights protests through the Deep South in the U.S., the Kent State University shootings in 1970, and the Vietnam War and its devastating aftermath on many military veterans returning to civilian life. "The music on my album speaks to me," Valentine says, "I think this is the most important music that I've done yet in my life."

Q&A with Gaye LeBaron Historian & Celebrity Author



Sonoma County Woman of the Year, 2015


Renowned *Press Democrat* columnist, historian, author, humorist, and Saddle Club member Gaye LeBaron is coming to Lunch & Learn on Thursday, May 16th. After several years as a reporter, Gaye wrote her first column for *The Press Democrat* in 1959 and was the daily columnist until her semi-retirement in 2001. At that time, she continued to contribute a "historical perspective" column twice monthly, fully retiring in 2022. Across an extraordinary 65-year career, Gaye told the stories of Sonoma County.

Gaye is the author, with three other researchers, of a two-volume local history, "Santa Rosa, a 19th Century Town," and "Santa Rosa a 20th Century Town," and, with Vermont author Bart Casey, "The Wonder Seekers of Fountaingrove," which is a history of Santa Rosa's 19th century Utopia.

She lectured for 35 years on Sonoma County history in SRJC's Community Education program and has taught several courses for SSU's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute. Gaye's letters and papers from some 40 years as a daily columnist are archived in Special Collections at the Schulz Library at SSU. What a treasure she is to our club and our community!
